- Through LAH3C Grant, we have institutionalized curriculum and developed a Senior Care Technician Certificate. Students work in Senior Centers providing Health Care.
 - Students receive MOCK INTERVIEW with LA Chamber of Commerce after completion of Pre-requisites.
 - Students receive DIGITAL BADGES throughout course work that demonstrate completion of various COMPETENCIES in the Health Care field.
 - The curriculum, certificate and use of both Portfolium and Digital Badges received high praise from members of the National Network of Health Career Programs in Two-Year Colleges.
 - Use of Portfolium with member of Health Care Industry to help them identify potential workers.
 - Potential is there to have LATTC be the site for yearly state required training for the industry.
 - Have had discussions with members of Culinary and Cosmetology about incorporating classes from their areas that attached to our curriculum would provide the Senior Sites with the qualified individuals who understand their clients diets or how to safely groom their clients.

- Willow Hall / J Building- Rat Infestation in Offices and Rooms (Multiple Years)
 - Not enough offices for Full Timers so they are spread out across campus. (MH, Willow, Cedar, Pool)
 - Some Instructor offices are in closets.(Multiple Years)
 - Locker Facilities in Willow Hall / J are filthy from overuse and hard to maintain/clean- Filthy, fear of MRSA.
 - Pool Deck is riddled with very deep holes and cracks that would damage ankles in stepped in incorrectly. Currently they are all covered with rubber mats. (Stop over and see them)
 - Difficult to secure locker rooms in Willow Hall- improper use from non-student population causing safety issues for women and men. Many times have found men “hanging out” in the women’s locker room. Thefts from lockers common.
 - Laurel Gym is outdated-Gym floor has lost its grip, bleachers are unsafe to use, glass in improper areas.
 - Ventilation in the Gym is poor even with exhaust fans on.
 - When fans are on, you cannot hear anything in the POOL area thus making it very unsafe to run classes during times when ventilation fans are on OR members in the GYM must go without the fans while classes are in session at the pool.
 - Most areas in Gym and J are NON-ADA compliant.
 - Clinical Lab spaces are not adequate for large classes and classes often have to be divided to get proper skills.

- Key Point above in that both J building and Gym FCI scores helped campus receive this funding.
 - Although Physical Education has a long history, our new Major in Kinesiology is fairly new, recording our first graduates last year.
 - Now being part of a pathway, with pathway counselors, we hope to see an increase in Kinesiology major students completing the program as the get the guidance they need.
 - Nursing is a very competitive program at LATTC and there are usually waitlists of many semesters for students wishing to get into the program.
 - The Health Occupations discipline which also was recently un-archived, has endless possibilities for growth given the proper facilities, lab spaces/clinical spaces, to provide proper instruction.
 - Future potential certificated programs as we grow include Athletic Training, Occupational Therapy, Certified Nursing Assistant, Officiating and Home Health Care Provider.
 - Kinesiology Leaders have often taken on other leadership roles for the campus (DL, Accreditation).
