Almost one hundred of our DMA students submitted their portfolios and 30 of them were selected to participate in a Nike Combine (like the NFL comprehensive tryouts) this past Saturday involving a total of 52 students. It took place at Honeypot-LA, a creatives warehouse on 12th near Olive. The twelve winning designers (4 each in footwear, athletic wear, and digital design) will receive an expense-paid plus salaried experience at the Nike Campus in Oregon for six months, and hopefully land a job. 
## Food Bank
